Dear Parents and Carers

This week, a group of Year 8 students took part in the IET Faraday Challenge Day at the Gatwick Stem Centre and we are delighted to announce that one of our teams won this stage of the competition! This is an annual competition made up of one day STEM activities, with the winning team from each day being added to the national leaderboard. The top teams from this leaderboard are then invited to take part in the national final to compete for a cash prize of £1,000 for their school. The students were given a brief from a client which they then had to research, design, and make prototype solutions which were then presented at the end of the day. All of the students represented the school exceptionally well, demonstrating numerous employability skills such as teamwork, communication, creativity, time management, and, of course, problem solving. We are very proud of them and look forward to sharing the outcome of the national final.

All Year 9 students participated in an excellent day programme for the Young Green Briton Challenge, where they worked in small teams with their peers to develop solutions to local environmental issues. We were so incredibly impressed with the ingenuity and collaboration, with students identifying very specific issues within our local context. Class winners are now due to be chosen, before a 'Dragons Den' event in early June where these winners will compete to be chosen for the National Final at City Hall in London on 1st July. We look forward to sharing the details of the winners with you, as well as the details of the Dragons Den event. A huge thank you must go to Mr Turner, Mr Nichols and Mr Monckton for organising, and to all Year 9 teachers and tutors for their support.

After this week's fantastic Spring Music Concert, we look forward to seeing you at the iDance event on Wednesday evening of next week (2nd April). Mrs Brinkhurst and team have been working hard with students who have put in hours of practice to be ready for this. We are so proud of the growing profile of the arts in the school and thankful for the staff who are leading this. We hope to begin work towards the Artsmark award in the near future and are excited by the interim findings of the DFE's Curriculum and Assessment review as it clearly suggests a greater profile for the Arts in the future.

This programme has obviously caused some national discussion around young people, their online presence and the material that ends up in their algorithms. This was further highlighted by Sir Gareth Southgate in his Richard Dimbleby Lecture last week (the full version can be found here:

You will remember that I recently wrote to you explaining our views on the importance of open dialogue with your children and how you can safeguard them in their use of mobile and internet-connected devices. This is important for all students and, as a parent of two boys, really resonates with me, particularly in the harmful discriminatory content that is aimed at them. We aim to be an anti-discrimination school and have recently spoken to all students about this in assembly. A fuller letter with some more detailed advice and guidance will follow from Mrs Best in the next week and we are planning further work in school to equip students to manage these communications and seek support as necessary.
